On 20 June 2024 Dr Amer Rehman attended the Bradford Royal Infirmary with Mr A and recorded five videos which were uploaded to a social media platform. When filming the videos Dr Rehman used his old identity card to access restricted areas when he knew that he was not currently working for Bradford Royal Infirmary and that he did not have permission to be in restricted areas. The videos, in which Dr Amer Rehman was identifiable as a doctor, were filmed to promote his political campaign and had the potential to mislead the public. This conduct does not meet with the standards required of a doctor. It risks undermining public protection, specifically public confidence in the profession and professional standards and conduct, and it must not be repeated. The required standards are set out in Good medical practice and associated guidance. In this case, paragraph 81 of Good medical practice is particularly relevant: 81. You must make sure that your conduct justifies patients' trust in you and the public's trust in your profession. Whilst this failing in itself is not so serious as to require any restriction on Dr Amer Rehman's registration, it is necessary in response to issue this formal warning.
