On 2 October 2025 Dr Shannon Bernard Healey was convicted of failing to give information relating to the identification of the driver of a vehicle when required to do so. They failed to notify the General Medical Council or their designated body, without delay, that they had been charged with the criminal offence. This behaviour does not meet with the standards required of a doctor. It risks undermining public protection, specifically public confidence in the profession and professional standards and conduct, and it must not be repeated. The required standards are set out in Good medical practice and associated guidance. In this case paragraphs 81 and 99 of Good medical practice are particularly relevant: 81. You must make sure that your conduct justifies patients' trust in you and the public's trust in your profession. 99. You must tell us without delay if, anywhere in the world: a. you have accepted a caution (or equivalent) from a prosecuting authority b. you have been charged with a criminal offence in person or by post c. you have been found guilty of a criminal offence. Whilst these failings are in themselves not so serious as to require any restriction on your registration, it is necessary in response to issue this formal warning. This warning will be published on the medical register in line with our publication and disclosure policy, which can be found at www.gmc-uk.org/disclosurepolicy.
